2. Crime Scene Processing/Sketch/Synopsis:

Each team will be dispatched to a crime scene. The team will demonstrate the proper procedures to secure and process a crime scene. Contestants should be familiar with scene safety; securing a scene; photographing a scene; sketching a scene; releasing a scene; identifying, collecting and preservation of a scene, etc.

3. Contestants must work together as a team without assistance from instructors, other contestants, or observers.
